Recovery Plan for Hudson River American Shad Released

DEC has announced the release of the <u>Recovery Plan for</u> Hudson River American Shad (PDF).

American shad is an economically and ecologically important migratory fish species that once supported a robust fishery in the Hudson River. Decades of intense fishing pressure coupled with years of low reproduction and non-fishing-related mortality events have further impacted the stock's resilience and exacerbated declines.

Significant actions have been taken to improve the Hudson River shad stock since the 2010 closure of the New York fisheries for shad, including reduced mortality at industrial water intakes and ocean-bycatch caps. However, conservative management and considerable patience are needed to return the Hudson River shad stock to levels with enough resilience for commercial and recreational harvest.



The plan delineates the recovery goals and benchmarks based on decades of annual monitoring data and the most recent American shad stock assessment. With the aim of long-term stock resilience, DEC will continue to gather data, identify challenges, and take management actions that are in line with recovery priorities and are supported by sufficient data. As this plan also outlines, the short-term objective is to reopen the catch-and-release fishery while supporting the long-term recovery objective of returning the stock to 1940s' levels. Riverkeeper Sweep

We're excited to share that this spring marks our 12th annual Riverkeeper Sweep, which will take place on Saturday, May 6, 2023 at over 100 locations from NYC to the Adirondacks. Over the last 11 years, Riverkeeper volunteers have completed 1,074 projects along hundreds of miles of shoreline, where they have removed 324 tons of debris, and planted or maintained 6,171 trees or native grasses.

We are aiming to make this year's Sweep the biggest one yet. Would you be interested in volunteering for Sweep or leading your own Sweep project at a local park, trail, or shoreline that needs assistance?

If you are interested in organizing a Sweep project, here are a handful of steps over the next 3 months that you must complete:

- 1. Determining a site in your community in need of a clean up
- 2. Obtaining landowner permission for your project
- 3. Recruiting volunteers
- 4. Making sure participants are safe and successful on Sweep day.

All of these steps are done with plenty of support from Riverkeeper, including two webinars we host throughout the process to make sure you're always ready for the next step. To get a sense of the timeline and process of leading a Sweep site, check out the Sweep Leader Checklist. Should this be something your organization wants to take on, the first step is to determine the project details and submit the 2023 Sweep Site Form by March 24. Anybody interested in participating as a volunteer can submit the <u>Volunteer Interest Form</u> to get an email with a full list of sites when registration opens on March 31.


